From majestic albatrosses sailing over ocean waves to Gray-crowned Rosy-Finches picking frozen insects from high mountain glaciers, the north Olympic Peninsula provides tremendous opportunities to find birds. This area ranges from soggy rainforests to the driest areas of western Washington, almost always leading the state in number of bird species seen during spring migration counts and Christmas bird counts.

This checklist compiles over 400 species of birds that have been seen within the boundaries of Clallam and Jefferson Counties, plus the offshore waters of the Strait of Juan de Fuca to the Pacific Ocean beyond the continental shelf. Use this card to tally species as you see them, either for different trips, locations, seasons, or periods of your choice.

Check eBird.org for locations and dates of recent sightings in Clallam and Jefferson Counties, along with bar charts of seasonal occurrences. Add to our knowledge by submitting your records of local birds, particularly unusual species.

***Italicized names indicate rare, vagrant, and/or irruptive species that have few records, so please provide additional documentation or photographs to verify these sightings.***
