

Seasonal and abundance categories indicate the general occurrence and numbers of each species.

Seasonal Periods

March-May = Northward migration and early breeding season

June-July = Late breeding season and post-breeding dispersal

August-October = Southward migration

November-February = Wintering

Abundance abbreviations

A = Abundant - seen in suitable habitats in large flocks every trip

C = Common - typically seen or heard in suitable habitats every birding trip, usually as individuals or small groups

FC = Fairly Common - often seen or heard reliably in suitable habitats, but not every trip

U = Uncommon - seen or heard only a few times each season or at a few specific locations

R = Rare - not seen every year during given period

E = Eruptive - seen in good numbers some years, but not seen at all in others, as in some finch species and Snowy Owls

V = Vagrant - seen 3 times or less on the N. Olympic Peninsula

UK = Unknown - probably present, but habitat not visited enough during respective season to establish abundance

Remember that the status and abundances of these birds may vary significantly depending on habitat availability, tides, and weather, so occurrences may differ between dates, localities, and years.

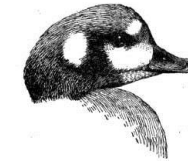

And Adjacent Offshore Waters

From deep ocean to alpine glaciers, from soggy rain forests to the driest region of western Washington, the north Olympic Peninsula provides birders with tremendous opportunities. From majestic albatrosses sailing over offshore waves to Gray-crowned Rosy-Finches picking frozen insects from high mountain glaciers, the birding can be truly spectacular. This area almost always leads Washington in high counts of species during the spring migration count and the Christmas bird count, a testament to the great birding of this region.

This checklist compiles the latest seasonal information for over 350 species of birds that have been seen within the boundaries of Clallam and Jefferson Counties, plus the offshore waters of the Strait of Juan de Fuca and the Pacific Ocean to beyond the continental shelf break. Such a checklist is obsolete from the moment it is printed, as information about bird distribution and movements constantly changes. You can add to our knowledge of north Olympic Peninsula birds by calling the Dungeness River Audubon Center (360-681-4076) or emailing rivercenter@olympus.net with your sightings.

Each entry shows the species' common name, its typical habitats, and an abundance code for each seasonal period.

Habitat Codes:

- P** = Pelagic, deep ocean
- L** = Coastal ocean, Strait of Juan de Fuca
- B** = Bays, estuaries, and tide flats
- S** = Shorelines, beaches, spits, and sea stacks
- C** = Coniferous forests
- D** = Deciduous/coniferous mixed forests
- A** = Alpine, high Olympic Mountains
- R** = Rivers
- F** = Fields, farmlands, and prairies
- M** = Marshes and ponds
- T** = Brush lands, thickets, and berry patches
- H** = Human habitats: towns, parks, yards, and feeders
- O** = Overhead, aerial flyers and soarers
